KOTA KINABALU: Sabah is the best model for the Malaysia Rahmah (compassionate Islam) concept that the Government is currently promoting, said Deputy Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Religious Affairs) Fuziah Salleh.

She said she was impressed by the people of Sabah who are unique and can continue to live in great harmony despite Sabahans being made up of various different races and ethnicities as well as reli-

gious backgrounds.

"I am impressed with the people of Sabah. They are unique. There is no feeling

of racialism among them.

"(What) I mean is that it is not like the Malays, Chinese and Indians in the peninsula where the separation gap between them is getting bigger. I do not know why (this is happening), maybe by design.

"But in Sabah, whether it is Kadazan, Dusun, Bajau, Bajau Laut, Murut, Sungai and so on, they all live in harmony. In a family there are Muslim and non-Muslim members, but they still live together under one roof, with great respect for each other...this is the concept of Rahmah (compassionate).

"The Malaysia Model that we want to have is based on Malaysia as a multiracial nation. That is why Sabah is the best model, a multiracial State but has great respect between one another," she said at a town hall session titled "Memaknai Rahmatan Lil Alamin Dalam Konteks Mahasiswa Bitara", in conjunction with the

"If in other states there are probably racial tension, in Sabah there is none. Because we have great respect between us, a lot of love and compassion among us," he
