KOTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah's (UMS) Non-Resident Management and Student Housing Facilities Centre (PNRF) has provided assistance to 250 of its non-resident students who were affected by the Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO) here.

Among the areas involved were the 1Borneo Apartment, Taman Ujana Kingfisher and the Universiti Utama Condominium (UUC) Apartment.

The assistance package included rice, canned foods, biscuits and packet drinks.

Tanuuja S Yavanathan, who
