UMS, Philippines university hold International Conference on Sustainability

KOTA KINABALU: Jose Rizal University (JRU), Philippines with the collaboration of the Faculty of Business, Economics, and Accountancy (FBEA), Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) organised the International Conference on Sustainability with the theme of A Multidisciplinary Approach in Manila recently.

According to the head of Tourism Management Program in UMS, Associate Professor Dr Awangku Hassanal Bahar Pengiran Bagul, the conference's objective is to provide academic discourse on sustainability issues in this region that resonates with current global concerns.

"This year, the conference is focusing on the recovery of many countries from the pandemic era and how sustainability could help build resilience to future global health crises.
