KOTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) under the Faculty of Business, Economics and Accountancy (FBEA), and Department of City Tourism Development, Kota Kinabalu City Hall (DBKK), organised a Community-Based Tourism Action Plan workshop for the community of Kampung Darau, Inanam recently.
