## POSTGRADUATE ASSISTANCE SCHEME (SBP) AWARD 2011/2012 SESSION

A total of 86 students were awarded the Postgraduate Assistance Scheme (SBP) for the 2011/2012 academic session. The percentage distribution of the recipients according to their academic field is as such: 68 per cent, out of the total number of recipients, are from the science cluster, while the remaining 32 per cent are from the non-science cluster. Students from the Master's program received made up the majority of the SBP recipients at 99 per cent, and only 2 students (1%) were from the Doctoral programme.

Looking at percentages of recipients based on their candidacy attachments, the School of Science and Technology recorded the highest number of recipients, i.e. 27 per cent, out of all schools in the science cluster. As for the non-science cluster, the School of Social Science holds the highest percentage at 17 per cent.

The statistics for the recipients of the Postgraduate Assistance Scheme according to clusters and School / Centre / Institute for the 2011/2012 session are presented in the next table.
