RM24m for Labuan UMS hall, library

LABUAN: The Universiti Malaysia Sabah-Labuan International Campus (UMS-KAL) received grants of RM24 million under the 10th Malaysia Plan for the construction of a new lecture hall and a library, expected to be ready in 2014.

The announcement was made at a function to honour UMS-KAL graduates, recently.

Samantha Lee, 23, was named the best overall student in Economics and

International Finance.

She was awarded a gold medal worth RM4,000 and a plaque, while Looi Rene and Lai Wai Yuen received silver and bronze medals worth RM3,000 and RM2,000, including plaques to commemorate their achievements.
