**THURSDAY, 19 JUNE** – The Kinabalu Management and Professional Conference was successfully held and entered its third edition this year, graced by renowned national figures and experienced panellists in the forums held.

Themed ‘Memperteguh Ketahanan Modal Insan, Memperkasa Tadbir Urus (Strengthening Human Capital Resilience, Intensifying Governance), the conference organised by the Management and Professional Officers (Non-academic) Association of Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) was participated by more than 200 participants.
