
Haze Phenomena, Drink Water Reminder

According to a statement issued by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment recently, investigations are being carried out on the seven hot spots detected in Sarawak by satellite images of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (MOAA)-18.

Its minister, Datuk Seri G. Palanivel said the government

will not hesitate to take appropriate action against those who do open fire after investigations into all the hot spots was carried out.
