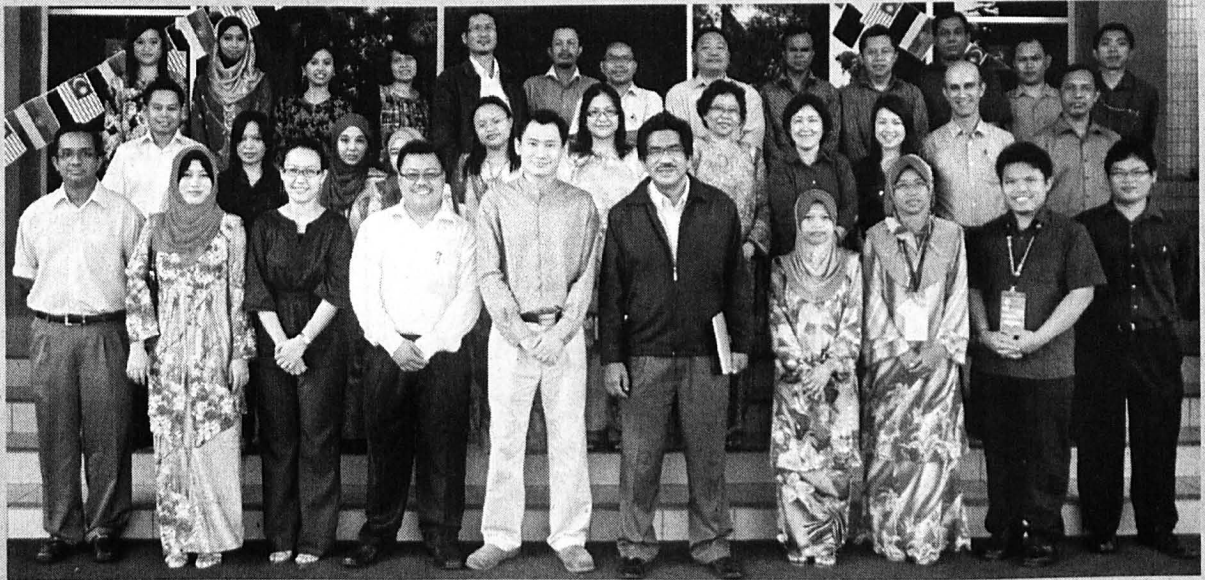
A Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) lecturer from the general studies centre, Dr Roosfa Hashim, conducted the two-day course.
