Dicranoloma havilandii An endemic moss to Mt. Kinabalu

Dicaranoloma havilandii Broth. is one of the seven species of Dicranoloma known to occur in Sabah. The type locality of this species is Mt. Kinabalu. It grows on tree bases, rocks, rotten logs and soil in subalpine forest, 2400m – 3500 m a.s.l.

This species is the only endemic Dicranoloma in Mt. Kinabalu. It is quite rare and seldom found growing in large population. It's whitish colour makes it easy to spot in the field, a feature shared by the White Moss or Lumut Putih, Leucobyum. Its smooth and inrolled leaf margins and erect-spreading leaves distinguish it from other members of the Dicranoloma. However, it can be confused with Braunfelsia edentula when not fruiting. The later species can be distinguished from the former by its weak costa (leaf mid-rib) and unbordered leave margins.
