KOTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) participants won a prize worth RM20,000 in the V Creator Programme final competition here recently.

The victory was obtained by Prof Associate Dr Wilson Yong Thau Lym from the Biotechnology Research Institute (IPB) through Seaweed Seedling Production System products.

Another winner, Felicia Ling Wen Xia, a student at the UMS Faculty of Food Science and Nutrition achieved success through the Agrowaste Biosorbant (Provera) product. Both of them received a

RM10,000 prize each.

The competition which took place in the UMS Postgraduate Auditorium Hall was organised in collaboration with the Sabah Entrepreneur Development Transformation Association (SET) of the Sabah Ministry of Industrial Development and Entrepreneurship (KPPK), and the UMS Industrial Collaboration and Engagement Center (PKLI).
