



UMS invites rangers for talk

ROTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) has invited rangers from the SOS Rhino Borneo (SOSRB), an international non-profit conservation foundation, to give a talk to the university's first conservation club.

The rangers have been in Sabah studying its rhinos and have been working with UMS since 2001, supporting five Masters students through their studies in conservation.

A research seminar will be held July 10, at which the rangers will share their experiences with students.

UMS and SOSRB are combining their effort to inspire incoming students to enter the field of conservation.

SOSRB will be helping the university to establish a club that will focus on raising awareness on Sabah rhinos.

The club will use the rhinos as its "flagship species" to develop programmes that demonstrate the various principles of conservation.

The SOSRB has been working with the Sabah Wildlife Department patrolling the forest reserves looking for the elusive creature.
