UMS students organise children's rights awareness programme

the program is a collaboration between FPP and the Sabah Human Rights Commission (SUHAKAM).

"Programme participants consist of parents and preschool children who are presented with various beneficial activities such as parenting talks, teaching and

learning sessions and sports.

"Apart from that, there is an activity with children carried

out by the students of the Early Childhood Education Bachelor's Degree Programme which is to make diorama crafts themed on marine life in the preschool

"This activity can foster children's interest in arts and crafts, and further increase their creativity and imagination," he explained.

At the programme, there was also a parenting talk explaining children's rights which include the Right to Life, the Right to Protection, the Right to Development, and the Right to Participation delivered by SUHAKAM representatives, Mohd Irsyad Hamilin and Oalista S. Dohny.
