UMS Vice-Chancellor Prof Datuk Dr Kasim Mansor in his speech said agriculture is a rapidly developing field and it is very important to the country's economy and food security.

Kasim said this industry not only provides many job opportunities, but also contributes to the country's food and revenue sources through the commercial crop industry such as palm oil.
