

KOTA KINABALU: Police arrested 28 National Service Programme trainees at two camps here yesterday following three fighting incidents.

One of the trainees, Reagan Augustine Mailidy, 18, was admitted to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital here after being attacked by a group of trainees near the dining hall of the Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) camp.

In the 9pm incident, Augustine received head injuries, Kota Kinabalu City Police Chief ACP Azizan Abu Taat said.

He said in connection with the fight at the UMS camp, seven trainees were arrested.

Two other fights occurred at the Likas Sports Complex Hostel where 21 trainees were arrested by police.

"All of them were released this (yesterday) morning after

their statements were recorded," Azizan told reporters here.

Azizan said police had since traced the UMS fight to some rough tackle during a game of football at the university stadium.

Augustine's father Mailidy Sikui Molijip when met at the hospital expressed unhappiness over the attitude of the camp management towards camp discipline, security and safety.

On the 1.30pm incident at the Likas Sports Complex, Azizan said it started with four trainees punching another.

The student was given outpatient treatment at the same hospital.

He said the third incident at about 10.30pm arose "over the brushing of shoulders" between two trainees! — Bernama
