## Native chief to research

PENAMPANG: Native chief Andrew S Lidaun is looking forward to doing his master's degree course at Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) as it would allow him to do a research on the use of native laws in the modern world.

The 59-year-old Andrew said he started his course at UMS in March as a follow-up to his bachelor's degree in psychology and counseling which he obtained from the same university last November.
