48 Brunei trainee teachers visit UMS-KAL

LABUAN: Forty-eight students from Brunei Religious Teachers University College made a study visit to Universiti Malaysia Sabah, Labuan International Campus (UMS-KAL) on June 21.

The final year students were led by the college lecturer, Haji Roslan Haji Untong, with two other lecturers.

UMS-KAL deputy registrar, Zamri Mohammad Tuah briefed the visitors on the administration and development of the campus, while other lecturers briefed the visitors on the faculties in UMS-KAL.

Zamri, who represented the

director of UMS-KAL Professor Dr Shariff Abdul Kadir Omang, hoped that a mutual relationship between UMS-KAL and the teachers' college would be built.

He added that UMS-KAL welcomed students from Brunei to study at the campus, besides students from China, Turkey and Tanzania.

Meanwhile, 30 staff of UMS-KAL attended a fire prevention and management course at the campus executive meeting room on the same day.

The one-day course was conducted by Labuan Rescue and Fire Department officer, Ahmad Azmir Rusidi.

Besides a lecture, Ahmad also taught the participants how to extinguish a fire, while a demonstration was carried out by seven fire and rescue personnel from Layang-Layangan Fire and Rescue Station.

UMS-KAL spokesperson said the purpose of the course was to expose the campus staff to the importance of safety and fire prevention in a building.

Ahmad advised the public to be alert to the danger of fire especially in home and told them that they were supposed to have a device to detect the fire and a fire extinguisher as early prevention tool.
