KOTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) and Kolej Yayasan Sabah (KYS) marked a historical day and a milestone with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) yesterday.

The MoU is centred on the collaboration and development of quality academic and technical programmes between the two parties, in particular in the field of engineering, information technology, business and economic.

The signing ceremony was held at Le Meridien Hotel here between UMS vice chancellor Prof Dr Mohd Harun Abdullah and KYS board of directors chairman Datuk Kamal DE Quadra.

It was witnessed by Yayasan Sabah director/ICSB executive chairman-cum-KYS board chairman Tan Sri Datu Khalil Datu Haji Jamalul, Deacon of UMS School of Engineering & Information Technology Prof Dr Rosalam Haji Sarbatly and deacon of UMS School of Business & Economic Prof Dr Haijah Arsiah Bahron.

In his address at the event, Dr Mohd said it is an honour for UMS to establish synergy cooperation on the academic development of KYS which is expected to benefit both parties, in addition to contributing quality human resources to Sabah.

"This MoU is significant and important as a catalyst factor to improve the quality and quantity of human resources specialising in the fields of engineering & information technology and business & financial management," he mentioned.

Thus, remarked Dr Mohd, this academic joint venture will ensure UMS and KYS continue to complement the country in the development of competitive human capital.

"This cooperation is based on the Blue Ocean Strategy which is in line with the government transformation plan for the purpose of increasing the effectiveness of implementing the national development plan," he added.

According to Dr Mohd, the main agenda of the MoU is to focus on the development of the academic curriculum that is UMS will help the KYS programme in offering cours-

es toward undergraduate degrees.

For a start, he said, the programme to be developed is the Bachelor of Arts in Engineering Technology degree programmes, majoring in automotive technology and building construction technology.

"In this context, our School of Engineering & Information Technology and School of Business & Economic have the ability and capacity to offer the expertise needed by KYS," he said.

Meanwhile, Kamal said earlier that he hoped the MoU can provide the much needed quality education for the young people studying in KYS.

"This collaboration will provide room to expand further in the development of the academic curriculum of KYS as we endeavour to bring KYS to higher level," he said.

According to Kamal, to achieve the higher level, KYS must ride with UMS in the field of education in order to bring benefits to Sabah, especially in providing quality and competitive human resources.

Commenting on the various 'failed' MoUs which KYS had entered into with Australian and Dutch universities, Kamal attributed it to the lack of commitment by both parties to implement the MoU as it involve a lot of money.

Normally these MoUs will lapse after six months if there

is no action taken to implement them, he said, adding that "KYS has learned their lessons".

Hence, Kamal described the MoU with UMS is the most ideal collaboration as the two institutions of higher learning are just next to each other and the students need not go very far to pursue their higher studies.

It was revealed that based on earlier discussion, the programme under the MoU will be an integration programme where KYS will also act as feeder after its students completed their diploma level and they will be absorbed by UMS to do their degree studies.

Touching on the progress of getting the university status for KYS, Khalil disclosed to reporters that it is still in the planning stage and preparation of the ground works before the proposal is submitted to the Ministry of Higher Education.

However, he said KYS new campus should be ready by June next year which will be part of the criteria in the obtaining university status for KYS.
