KOTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) Vice Chancellor Brig. Gen. Prof. Datuk Dr Kamaruzaman Ampon said UMS has produced a total of 27,833 graduates since 1999 to 2009 and they have become part of the human capital for the nation's development.
