KOTA KINABALU: The Sabah Umno Liaison Committee is consistent in its stand to give undivided support to party presidentcum-Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

Its Chairman and Chief Minister Datuk Seri Musa Aman said this stems from its commitment to remain loyal to the party's struggle. "We must continue to defend out president. We will continue to support our Prime Minister and all the current leadership.
