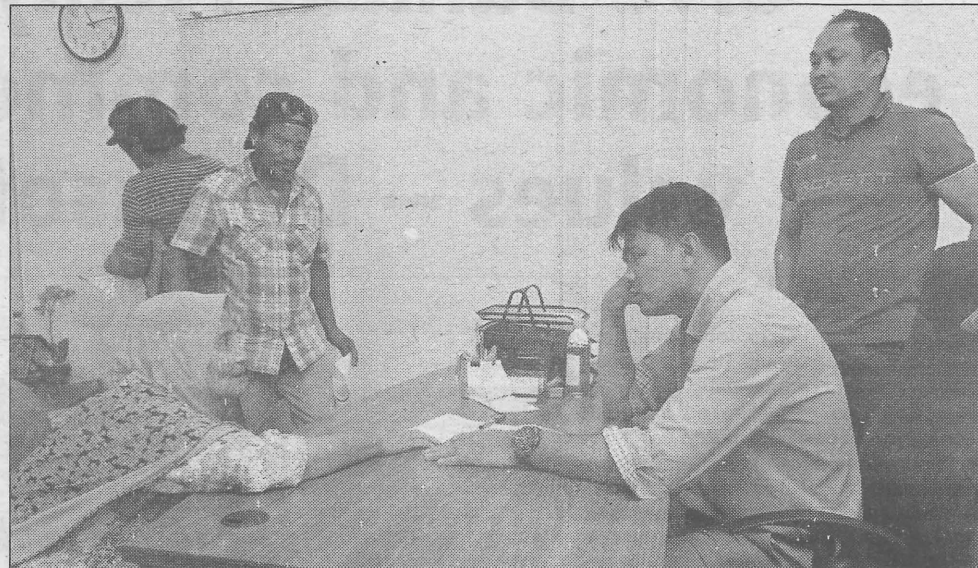


Young told to be exemplary for next generation
