## 25 China students at UMS under exchange program

KOTA KINABALU: Some 25 engineering students from Wuyi University in Jiangmen City, China, have arrived at Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) to undertake project management and English language courses.

The student exchange programme was the result of the signing of a Letter of Intent (LOI) between Wuyi University and UMS, which was witnessed by the Consul General of the People's Republic of China in Kota Kinabalu, Liang Caide, in October last year.
