2,000 fans catch World Cup final live at UMS

KOTA KINABALU: Around 2,000 football enthusiasts gathered to watch the FIFA World Cup final screened live over a giant LED screen at the Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) mini stadium on Sunday night.

There were also food trucks and stalls to cater for the huge crowd at the programme which was organised in conjunction with the finale to the greatest show on earth.

A month on and 63 games later, the 2018 World Cup hosted by Russia reached its climax with its 64th game on Sunday night, where France took on Croatia in the final played at the Luzhniki Stadium in Moscow.

France would go on to win 4-2 in a thrilling title match to claim their second World Cup title after their maiden victory in 1998.
