UMS' own teaching

hospital by 2021

KOTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) will have its own teaching hospital by 2021, said its Vice-Chancellor Prof Datuk Dr D Kamarudin D Mudin.

Kamarudin said work on the RM652 million hospital located on a 110,851 square metres in the university's main campus, began in December last year.

He added that the hospital is expected to be completed by the end of 2020 or early 2021. Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak is scheduled to launch the hospital construction project today (Friday).

Kamarudin said the hospital would benefit the local people, especially in Sepanggar, as well as Sabah in general.

He added that the hospital, which will have 400 beds, will offer quality medical and health services at reasonable costs to the local people.
