100 UMS medical students adopted by Kudat folks

DE 20.12.2017 KUDAT: The University-Family Sharing Programme (Pupuk) started by the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FPSK) of Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) since 2006 continues to be a platform for medical students to interact with communities in the State's interior area.
