Ex-Customs chief steps up to the plate

KOTA MARUDU: Sabah's former director of Customs revealed at a party political gathering here early this week he intended to pursue a path in politics full time to serve the state and people.

And, he also has a PhD in Creative Arts from Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) while he was still in the civil service.

Dr Janathan was a New Sabah Times columnist for a brief period.

Also present at the gathering were Assistant Community Development and Consumer Affairs Minister Datuk Anita Baranting who is also the elected representative of Tandek; former Kota Marudu MP Datuk George Sangkin; KAM leader Datuk Latiff Kandok as well as PBS branch leaders.
