## Take pledge seriously - MACC

KOTA KINABALU: Civil servants who have taken the Corruption Free Pledge are reminded to take the matter seriously and not treat it as a game.

Malaysia Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) Sabah director Datuk Sazali Salbi said the pledge must be well understood and practised.

"Once you have taken the pledge, you should not be involved in corruption practice or abuse of power because we have promised to uphold our integrity towards our subordinate, colleagues, and the community we serve.


"But there are some civil servants who took the pledge without understanding the true meaning or think that they can do whatever they like without realizing the consequences," he said at the Free Corruption Pledge program at the Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) here yesterday.

Sazali also urged the public to register as the 'Anti Corruption Revolution Movement' or Gerakan Revolusi Anti Rasuah (Gerah) that was launched on May 8.

He said the revolution, which is non-violence and non-political was created to ensure the public understood corruption and abuse of power.

"Like all enforcement agencies, we need the cooperation of the public in fighting corruption together.

"So I would like to urge the public to take the time and register as 'Gerah' so we can fight corruption together," he said.
