New UMS V-C wants to respond effectively

to needs

NOTA KINABALU: Prof Dr D. Kamarudin D. Mudin, who has been appointed as Vice-Chancellor of Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) effective June 18, wants to respond more effectively to the needs of the stake-holders.

The stakeholders include the Ministry of Higher Education, the Government and the community who want UMS to become a dy-

namic university.

"We cannot be left out in terms of technology, the method of teaching and learning, research to make UMS known on the world stage. "Borneo is a vast area yet to be explored.
