The other two are Politeknik Kuching and Kolei Yayasan Sabah.

The IPT League also has three other divisions for Peninsular Malaysia state teams. The winners of the Borneo Division will compete in the knockout stage where 15 other teams will join the fray.

They include all eight teams from Division I, the top four teams from Division II, top two teams from Division III and the winners in the play-off between the runners-up in the Borneo Division and the winners from the Qualifying Zone Final Round.
