

The formation of the cabinet also saw the appointment of Md Najib Rubin and Anwar Tawe as vice presidents of MPP for UMS Labuan International Campus

and UMS Sandakan Branch

Campus respectively.

The MPP consists of seven general seats allocated for the main campus in Kota Kinabalu, two seats for Labuan campus and one for Sandakan campus.

The council also includes a total

of 29 school seats - 22 from the main campus, four from Labuan campus and two from Sandakan campus.

A total of 15,848 students were eligible to vote this year. Polling started from 8am till 5pm simultaneously in the main campus and Labuan campus. Meanwhile, all candidates from the Sandakan campus won unopposed.

The result was announced by deputy vice chancellor of student affairs and alumni, Professor Madya Datuk Dr Kasim Md Mansur.

The other six students who won the general seats from the main campus were Nurafizah Ahmad Marif, Nurlina Arappe, Shelly Arba'ani, Noorhazana Samsuddin, Saripuddin Mappiasi and Wong Tvan Tzu.

Md Najib Rubin and Siti Zulaikha Meseri won the general seats allotted for Labuan campus while Anwar from Sandakan campus won unopposed.
