More China students in Labuan UMS

LABUAN: As in many cases, female students outnumber males in the intake of students for the new academic session of 2011/12 at the Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) Labuan International Campus.

The intake of 631 students comprises 393 females and 235 males. Students from China also recorded an increase, with 73 of them enrolling. Out of these, 46 were males and 27 females.

The campus offers two schools of studies, namely International Business and Finance and Informatics Science. Five hundred and eleven of them would be in the Finance studies and the other 111 in the school of Informatics Science.

With the new intake, the campus has about 2,000 students. The campus, established in 1999, had recently applied for RM24 million under the 10th Malaysia Plan to upgrade its facilities.

The students were met by its Director, Prof. Madya Shariff AK Omang, and other staff on arrival at the Labuan International Passenger Ferry Terminal.

Later, they were given an orientation talk at the campus hall.
