UMS orators ranked 313 in world university championship

KOTA KINABALU: Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) recently sent two debaters to take part in the World University Debate Championship (WUDC) in Rajalakshmi Engineering College, Chennai, India.

According to the UMS Student Affairs and Alumni officer Rohani Hadi, the debaters from the Business and International Finance School in UMS Labuan were sent there to gain experience and get exposure in prestigious events to be shared with o ther university debaters.

"Out of 360 participating universities, our orators were placed 313. The result was unexpected because we managed to beat other universities featuring more experienced debaters compared to our young competitors," she said.

The team managed to beat other universities before their defeat such as Moscow State University, Russia, Yogyakarta State University, Indonesia and Aoyama Gakuin University, Japan.
