UMS denies prohibiting Christmas celebration in campus

Its vice-chancellor Prof Datuk Dr Mohd Harun Abdullah said the university had never prohibited staff or students from organising any festive activity, including Christmas celebration, on the campus.

Describing it as a misunderstanding, he said the proposed Christmas celebration was approved much earlier, adding that UMS had also provided a budget for it to be organised. In a statement here yesterday, he said UMS had also supported the students' idea of having it on a big scale and getting the local community to join in the celebration.

UMS had also given a choice for the celebration to be held either on-campus or off-campus, considering the expected crowd, traffic and parking problems.
