administration of the centre is managed by UMS business and commercial arm, UMS Investment Holdings Sdn Bhd (UiNVEST).

EVIC serves as an information centre and entry ticketing booth. It also provides services such as electrical bicycles and buggies for visitors who would like to

move around the campus ground. Proceeds from the tickets will be used to improve the services rendered to tourists visiting UMS.

In an effort to maintain, nurture and conserve the natural beauty of UMS, Kamarudin said an Eco Campus Management Centre was established in February 2013 as a body to implement, enforce, monitor and assess the key elements of the Eco Campus Transformation Plan

"As a result of this, we are evolving from being just a university with beautiful landscapes towards a brand that is unique for Sabah which attracts tourists worldwide, who come to appreciate the natural beauty of our campus. Slowly but surely, we become a must-visit place for tourists who come to Sabah," he said.

Kamarudin invited tour operators to work together with UiNVEST in promoting UMS as one of the 'must go places' in Kota Kinabalu.

"We hope that such smart partnership can further boost the tourism industry in Sabah," he said.
