The seminar on "sustainable development and management of aquatic resources" is to address concerns on the decline of capture fisheries in Malaysia.

With the increasing demand of seafood, Malaysia has identified aquaculture as a National Key Economic Area and set a production target of over 700,000 metric tons under the 10th Malaysia Plan (2011-2015) which can only be met by the application of science and technology.
