## Preference for local coaches

Its Permanent Secretary, Mohd Yusrie Abdullah, said the dependency on foreign coaches, for the longterin, actually do not give profit to the State.

"Therefore, it is better for us to produce world-class local coaches," he said at the closing of the Sport Science Level II Course, National Coaching Certification Scheme (SPKK) 2019, held at the Faculty of Psychology and Education, Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) here Friday.

The six-day course under the National Coaching Academy (AKK) was organised by the National Sport Institute (ISN) with the collaboration of State Sport Council (MSN).

"Qualified and experienced coaches are presently greatly needed to coordinate various training programmes at all levels, especially at the school-level.

"To me, a course like this is vital and the best platform for uplifting the sports glory in our country, because it is meant to train, equip and increase the knowledge of coaches in the field of sport science.

"Apart from that, it will give exposure on how sport science knowledge can advance and increase the performance and achievement of sports in the country,"

he explained.

The course was participated by 41 participants from throughout the State, including seven school teachers, 27 participants from various fields and six MSN appointed coaches and trainee coaches, as well as a special athlete (OKU) coach.

"I am pleased with the great participation, it is a good sign that our sport industry is developing from time to time, in line with rapid development of sports worldwide," he said, adding every knowledge garnered in the course is part of the government effort to produce more local coaches who dare to make changes.

He said the participation of Sabah's weightlifting athlete, Aricco Jumitih, who won Gold in the Commonwealth Games New Delhi 2010 also showed former national athletes also have the opportunity to serve as a professional coach through such a course.

Mohd Yusrie said the Ministry, through MSN, is always attentive and working hard to enhance the knowledge of coaches in line with technology advancement in the coaching field.
