5,003 students receive scrolls at 20th UMS Convocation Ceremony

A total of 4,267 graduated with a Bachelor's Degree, 55 graduated with a PhD, 603 graduated with a Master's Degree and 69 students graduated with a Diploma.

Of the total number of graduates, 195 of them obtained First Class Honours, 89 were B40 students, 146 international students, 14 graduates with disabilities and two graduates received their awards

This year, 56 per cent of the students were Sabahans and 41

per cent was from other states. In his speech, Juhar reminded the graduates that the presentation of scrolls should serve as a symbol of the potential

future.

"We, the old generation, will eventually leave and you (the graduates) will continue our legacy and be the successor of the state's and country's glory," said
