Thirty-one UMS students elected to Students Representative Council


KOTA KINABALU: Thirty-one Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) students were elected to the university's Students Representative Council (MPP) on Wednesday.

Of the 31, 20 students won the faculty seats while 11 won the general seats. All these students were from the main campus in Kota Kinabalu and the other campuses in Sandakan and Labuan FT.

The MPP consists of 20 faculty seats and 11 general seats.

UMS Deputy Vice chancellor (Student Affairs and Alumni) Prof Dr Ismail Ali said before the announcement of the 2018/2019 MPP election results that the university students must play their part by voting students leaders of calibre to the MPP.

Meanwhile, election chairperson Associate Prof Dr Normah Awang Besar said there was a decline in the percentage of students who cast their votes – from 57.1 per cent previously to 43.33 per cent this time around.
